- 1** **WIOA Disability-Related Reporting:** DRIVE is the only site from which you can retrieve [WIOA Reporting](#) data related to people with disabilities in your state, county or Employment & Training Administration (ETA) region.
- 2** **National Disability & Employment Data:** There is no other single site that provides up-to-date [national](#) disability employment data from the U.S. Census Bureau, Bureau of Labor Statistics, Social Security Administration (SSA), SSA's Ticket Tracker, State Data: National Report on Employment Services and Outcomes, Department of Labor Wage and Hour, and more.
- 3** **State-level Disability & Employment Data:** Click on **State Profiles** to access your state or territory and find up-to-date State-level data in the areas of education, mental health, vocational rehabilitation, and more.
- 4** **State-Level WIOA Profiles:** Click on the **WIOA Profile** [for your state](#) to find 16 elements from your WIOA State Plan and State Plan Modification from a disability perspective.
- 5** **State-level Policies & Initiatives:** Click **Policies and Initiatives** in your State Profile to find Executive Orders, Policies, Legislation, information about Systems Change initiatives, Partnership Agreements, and more in your state to support employment outcomes for people with disabilities.
- 6** **Provider Transformation:** DRIVE has up-to-date [Provider Transformation Resources](#), sorted into categories like Leadership, Strategic Planning, Making it Happen, Funding, Data, and more.
- 7** **State Comparison Tool:** Use the [State Comparison Tool](#) to compare your state to another state in areas like State Data, information in your WIOA State Plan Profile, State VR rates and services (to be updated Summer 2020).
- 8** **Veteran Resources:** On the [home page](#), explore resources to promote employment for Veterans with disabilities.
- 9** **Most Integrated Employment Setting Self-Assessment and HCBS Employment Services Analysis:** The [Most Integrated Employment Setting State Self-Assessment](#) assists states in meeting their obligations under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act and the HCBS Settings Rule to ensure people with disabilities in publicly funded employment services are served in the most integrated setting possible.

WIOA Disability-Related Reporting



Here is a quick overview of the type of information you can access through this interactive data visualization tool.

Maps provide a graphic representation of participants' disability status by state and county.

Example 1: 5.2% of WIOA/WP/JVSG participants nationwide indicated having a disability.



Example 2: 73.7% of WIOA/WP/JVSG participants nationwide did not indicate their category of disability.



Tables allow users to filter State-, County-, and ETA Region-level data across all disability data elements.





WHAT DATA IS AVAILABLE AND HOW MIGHT WE USE IT?

- ▶ What questions related to serving people with disabilities might we want to be informed by data?
- ▶ For example
 - ▶ Who is served by American Job Centers (AJCs)?
 - ▶ How do our reported data compare to the statewide or national averages?
 - ▶ How many participants are receiving services from other systems and in which systems are they involved?



LEAD CENTER'S DRIVE SITE AS A RESOURCE FOR WORKFORCE BOARDS AND STAFF FOR:

- ▶ Tracking Quality Improvement
- ▶ Providing data for reports and testimony
- ▶ Benchmarking your state against other states
- ▶ Informing AJC certification in specific areas



WORKFORCE BOARDS AND AJC CERTIFICATION

- ▶ WIOA requires American Job Centers be evaluated at least every three years for:
 - ▶ Effectiveness
 - ▶ Physical and programmatic accessibility
 - ▶ Continuous improvement



WORKFORCE BOARDS AND AJC CERTIFICATION

- ▶ A minimum level of quality and consistency of services is required across a state.
- ▶ Certification criteria allow states to set standard expectations for customer-focused seamless services from:
 - ▶ A network of employment, training, and related services that help individuals overcome barriers to obtaining and maintaining employment.










INDIVIDUAL WITH A DISABILITY

- ▶ 5.2% of WIOA/WP/JVSG participants nationwide indicated having a disability




DISABILITY STATUS NOT KNOWN

- ▶ 11.5% of WIOA/WP/JVSG participants' disability status is unknown

- ▶ 73.7% of participants nationwide did not indicate their category of disability



INDIVIDUAL WITH A DISABILITY: BY PROGRAMS

Participant Group	Disability Indicated	Disability Status Unknown
WIOA Adult Program (N = 1,951,276)	6.7% (N = 131,400)	23.3% (N = 454,864)
WIOA Dislocated Worker Program (N = 1,137,667)	4.8% (N = 54,661)	23.9% (N = 272,180)
WIOA Youth Program (N = 297,836)	15.1% (N = 45,040)	5.0% (N = 14,861)
WP/JVSG Program (N = 11,912,046)	5.0% (N = 589,983)	9.9% (N = 1,177,855)

Participant counts may overlap, as some participants are co-enrolled in more than one program
